JUDGMENTS—A judgment against one or more members of a partnership, &c. less than the whole number of partners, &c. shall not work an extinguishment, &c. of the cause of action on which such judgment may have been rendered, as respects the liability of the partners, &c. not bound by such judgments, but they shall remain liable to be sued as if their original responsibility had been joint and several, but one satisfaction of the debt or demand shall be

made,
