

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That every commissioner appointed as aforesaid, before he shall proceed to perform any duty under and by virtue of this law, shall take and subscribe an oath or affirmation before a justice of the peace in the city or county in which such commissioner shall reside, well and faithfully to execute and perform all the duties of such commissioner under and by virtue of the laws of this State, which oath or affirmation shall be filed in the Executive office of this State.

CHAPTER 98.

An act for the relief of Basil D. Hall, of Anne Arundel county. Passed Feb. 27, 1838.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of Anne Arundel county, and the justices of the levy court of Prince George's county are hereby authorised and required, each, to pay Basil D. Hall, of Anne Arundel county, a sum of money not exceeding fifty dollars, and they are hereby authorised and required to assess and levy the same on the assessable property of their respective counties in the same manner as other county taxes are assessed and levied; *provided*, that nothing in this act shall be construed to exonerate the said Basil D. Hall from his obligation to keep in repair for ten years, the bridge over the Patuxent river, known by the name of Governor's Bridge, as required by the act of the General Assembly at December session eighteen hundred and thirty-one, chapter one hundred and fifty-nine.
