

CHAPTER 106.

CHAP. 106.

An act for building a Bridge over Big Elk Creek, near Garrett's Factory, in Cecil county, on the main road leading from Dysart's Tavern to Fair Hill. Passed Mar. 1, 1838.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That William Mackey, William Garrett, and Joseph Alexander be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to fix upon a scite near Garrett's Factory on the main road leading from Dysart's Tavern to Fair Hill, in Cecil county, for building a bridge over said creek; and the said commissioners are hereby authorised to erect, or cause to be erected a good and substantial bridge, to be done in a workmanlike manner, and for a sum not exceeding eight hundred dollars. Commissioners to build

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the commissioners of Cecil county be, and they are hereby authorised and required to levy upon the assessable property of said county, at their next levy, the sum of three hundred dollars, and in eighteen hundred and thirty-nine a further sum of three hundred dollars, and in eighteen hundred and forty a further additional sum of two hundred dollars, and have them collected as other levies are, and made payable to said bridge commissioners. Levy directed

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the said bridge commissioners shall keep a fair and accurate account of their expenditures in erecting said bridge, and in case there shall be any thing left after said bridge is finished they shall pay the same over to the county commissioners, to be by them applied to the use of said county; a majority of the said bridge commissioners shall be competent to transact any business relative thereto. SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That the county commissioners shall allow said bridge commissioners a reasonable compensation for their services. Compensation
