

vernment, hereafter to be elected and appointed, shall be entitled to receive at the rate of the following annual salaries, in current money, whilst they continue in office, that is to say: the Governor the sum of four thousand two hundred dollars; the Secretary of State the sum of two thousand dollars, to be in full for all services that the law does now or may hereafter require said officer to perform: and they are hereby required to reside at the Seat of Government; the Messenger to the Governor, who shall be appointed by, and hold his office during the pleasure of the Governor, and perform the duties now attached to the office of Messenger of the Executive Council, the sum of four hundred dollars.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the office of Messenger of the Executive Council be, and the same is hereby abolished.

CHAPTER 132.

An act to divorce Alice Green, of Prince George's county, from her husband, Thomas Green. Passed Mar. 6, 1838

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Alice Green, of Prince George's county, be, and she is hereby declared to be, divorced from her husband, Thomas Green, *a mensa et thoro*.

CHAPTER 133.

An act supplementary to an act, entitled, an act to establish Magistrates' Courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, passed December session, eighteen hundred and thirty-five, chapter two hundred and one. Passed Mar. 8, 1838.

SECTION. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That when any sheriff, deputy sheriff or constable shall make an arrest on any capias issued by virtue of the act of Assembly, passed December session eighteen hundred and thirty-five, entitled, an
