SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners be, and they are hereby authorised, at their discretion, to sell all that narrow piece of ground, a part of Saint Claire Street, on the north side thereof, and on the east of Market Street, which has been rendered of no use to said town, in consequence of the construction of the Baltimore and Port Deposit Rail Road, and the same to convey to any person or persons, and upon such terms as the said commissioners may deem right and proper, any other law to the contrary notwithstanding.
