

erick county, and the expense of surveying and opening so much thereof as may pass through Carroll county, shall be levied on and paid by Carroll county, and the Levy Court of Frederick county and the Levy Court of Carroll county, respectively, are hereby authorised and required, on receiving from the commissioners, an account on oath, of the said expenses including an allowance of two dollars per day to the commissioners, for their services, to levy the same in the proportion before stated, on the assessable property in said counties, to be collected as other county charges are now collected.

CHAP. 21.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the commissioners, or a majority of them, shall learn and ascertain the damages that may be sustained by any person or persons, through whose land the said road may be made to pass; taking into consideration the advantages and disadvantages, if any, and the damages so ascertained shall be so levied and assessed as other county charges in said counties and shall be paid by the county wherein such damages may be sustained.

Damages assessed

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners or a majority of them before they proceed to act, shall take an oath or affirmation, before some justice of the peace, that they will, without favour, partiality, or prejudice, assess the damages sustained by the persons through whose land the said road may pass.

## CHAPTER 21.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That James Lynch of Cecil county, be and he is hereby divorced from his wife Mary Ann Lynch, *a mensa et thoro*.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the said James Lynch shall not be liable for any debt to be hereafter contracted by the said Mary Ann Lynch, nor be entitled to any property which she may hereafter acquire, nor shall the said Mary Ann Lynch, be entitled to any
