

**CHAP. 183.** the peace in and for said county, be, and the same is hereby confirmed and made as valid and effectual in law for all purposes whatsoever, as if the said deed duly recorded on the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, in the clerk's office of Charles county, State of Maryland, has been executed and acknowledged according to all the requirements of the laws of this State.

CHAPTER 183.

Passed Mar. 20, 1838. *An act to revise and alter the divisional lines between election districts number one, and number ten, in Allegany county, and to change the place of holding the elections.*

Preamble

WHEREAS, it is represented to this General Assembly, by the petition in writing of sundry citizens of Allegany county, that their convenience would be greatly promoted by the alteration of the divisional lines between election districts number one and number ten, in said county:—Therefore,

Commissioners to review

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Joseph Biggs, James D. Armstrong and Israel Thompson, of Allegany county, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, and they or a majority of them, be, and they are hereby authorised to review said divisional lines between districts number one and number ten, in said county, and in their discretion make such alteration therein and in the place for holding the elections, as better to subserve the convenience of the citizens thereof, and the said commissioners shall make return of all their proceedings to Allegany county court, to be there recorded at the expense of said county, and paid as county charges are levied and paid; and the Governor is hereby authorised and directed to nominate, and by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, appoint a commissioner or commissioners in place of any of the said commissioners therein named, who may die, resign, refuse or fail to act in said commission.*
