

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the commissioners herein appointed, or authorised to be appointed, shall be entitled to receive such compensation for their services as the commissioners of Allegany county may deem reasonable; *provided*, the same shall not exceed two dollars per day, for every day they shall be necessarily employed in discharging the duties required by this act.

CHAPTER 184.

An act to provide for the erection of a Stone Bridge over Antietam Creek, at John Sharre's Mill, in Washington county. Passed Mar. 20, 1838.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of Washington county be, and they are hereby authorised and required to examine whether the public convenience require that there should be a stone bridge built over the Antietam, at John Sharre's Mill, and if in their opinion the public require such a bridge, they shall cause to be erected a substantial stone bridge, upon such plan, terms and conditions, and under such superintendance as they may deem most conducive to the public interest, and that they be, and are hereby authorised and required to levy on the assessable property of said county, such sum or sums of money as they shall deem necessary to defray all expenses incurred in and about the erection of said bridge.

CHAPTER 185.

An act to alter and change the line between the election districts number one and number six, in Washington County. Passed Mar. 20 1838.

WHEREAS, it is represented to this General Assembly, that the convenience of several of the voters of districts number one and six, would be promoted by altering the division line of said election districts, so
