CHAPTER 270.

Passed Mar. 22, 1838, *An act supplementary to an act, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Port Deposit Rail Road Company, passed December session eighteen hundred and thirty-one, chapter two hundred and eighty-eight.*

Preamble

WHEREAS, doubts have been expressed by some of the commissioners named in said act whether they have power or not, under said law, to summon and compel the attendance of witnesses:—Therefore,

Authority to issue subpoenas for witnesses

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners named in the act to which this is supplementary, or their successors, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to issue subpoenas and attachments, which it shall be the duty of the sheriff, or whose hands the same shall be placed, to serve so as to enforce the attendance before said commissioners, of such witnesses as either of the parties to the case that shall be under consideration, by the said commissioners, may require or deem it necessary to have the testimony of; and that the said witnesses shall be paid according to the rate for attending before the county court, by and at the expense of said company, in the same manner as the said company is to pay the said commissioners and their clerk; provided,*
