SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That in case the said hay Authority to scales cannot be rented or purchased, then, and in that event, the said inspectors are hereby authorised, under the direction of the Governor, to purchase a lot of ground, and to erect and keep in repair two hav scales. or apparatus for weighing hay brought to the city of Baltimore for sale.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That all hay or straw All hay, &c. to brought to the city of Baltimore for sale, either by land or water, except hay in bundles, shall be weighed by the inspectors authorised to be appointed by this act, at the scales erected by the inspectors aforesaid, and no other place, at the rate of two thousand pounds to 2000lbs. to ton the ton, and no more; and it shall be the duty of the said inspectors to make a reasonable allowance for the moisture of said hay or straw, as well as for mud, or any other substance attached to the carriage; and the Inspector's fee said inspectors shall receive forty cents for each waggon load of hay or straw, and twenty cents for each cart load of hay or straw weighed, and no more, which shall be paid by the seller; and the said inspectors shall Certificate give a certificate of each and every load so weighed, stating the gross and nett weight of such straw or hay and waggon, cart or carriage; and if any seller of such Penalty for neglecting, &cc. hay or straw, shall neglect or refuse to have the same weighed on the day of the delivery thereof, he shall forfeit and pay for every such neglect or refusal, the sum of five dollars.

SEC. 5.
