CHAP. 329.

A supplement to an act to incorporate the Boston and New York Coal Company, passed December session eighteen hundred and thirty-five. Passed Mar. 28, 1838.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Authority to charge toll, &c.
That it shall be lawful for the Boston and New York Coal Company, upon the rail road which they are authorised to construct, from their mines to the basin of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, or other points in or near the town of Cumberland, to ask, demand and have the same rates or prices for tolls and transportation of persons and property thereon transported, as the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company is or shall be by law allowed to charge and receive.

CHAPTER 328.

An act to exempt from Taxation the Parsonage House of the Episcopal Church, in Chestertown. Passed Mar. 28, 1838.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Exemption
That the Parsonage house and lot of ground of the Protestant Episcopal Church, situate and being in Chestertown, in Kent county, be, and the same is hereby released from the payment of taxes, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER 329.

An act to divorce Julia Ann Stevens, from her husband, Charles R. Stevens. Passed Mar. 28, 1838.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Divorce
That Julia Ann Stevens, of Talbot county, be, and she is hereby divorced from her husband, Charles R. Stevens.
