CHAP. 357.

An act for the appointment of Commissioners to designate a place of Election in the Salisbury District, in Somerset County. Passed Mar. 30, 1838.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Commissioners That John Parsons, John Rider and Humphrey Humphreys are hereby appointed commissioners, to designate and determine upon some suitable house in the town of Salisbury, for holding all elections in said election district, and the above named commissioners are hereby required to report to the clerk of Somerset county the place designated, on, or before the first day of July next, to be recorded in the office of said clerk:

CHAPTER 357.

A supplement to the act for the promotion of Internal Improvement, passed at the adjourned May session, eighteen hundred and thirty-six, chapter three hundred and ninety-five. Passed Mar. 30, 1838.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That it shall be the duty of the Treasurer of the Western Shore to provide, in such manner as he may deem most expedient for transmitting to Europe and there disbursing securely and punctually, all such sums of money as from time to time may be necessary to defray the interest which is to accrue on the certificates of debt of this State created and issued, or to be issued under the provisions of the act for the promotion of internal improvement, passed at the adjourned May session eighteen hundred and thirty-six, chapter three hundred and ninety-five, and in the discharge of the duties hereby imposed on him, he shall be entitled to the assistance of the Commissioner of Loans of this State.
