Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to Jane Bishop, who was the widow of Leonard Ennis, a soldier of the revolution, the half pay of a private during her life, as a further remuneration for his services.

Resolution in favor of Walter H. S. Mitchell, admin-Passed Feb. 24, istrator of John Edelen.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Walter H. S. Mitchell, administrator of John Edelen, or order, the sum of twelve dollars, which sum appears to have been due said Edelen at the time of his death, on the journal of accounts of said Treasurer.
