Resolution in favor of Margaret Lee.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to Margaret Lee, the widow of Dudley Lee, out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, the half pay of a private during her life, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war.*

Resolution relative to Wetipquin Academy, and Franklin School, in Somerset County.

Passed Mar. 21,  
1838.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Justices of the Orphans' Court of Somerset county, be, and they are hereby authorised and required to pay over to the Trustees of the Franklin School, of Somerset county, or their order, the sum of one hundred and eighty dollars, and to the trustees of the Wetipquin Academy, or their order, the like sum of one hundred and eighty dollars. these sums being together, the amount of the unexpended balance in the hands of said justices of the orphans' court: and the sum of two hundred dollars to each of the said schools, their trustees or their order, annully hereafter, out of the part of the interest of the surplus funds of the United States, which may be apportioned to Somerset county.*
