RESOLUTIONS.

No. 59.

Passed Mar. 29, 1838, Resolution directing the Armorer at Annapolis, to deliver to Captain John C. Brown, of the City of Baltimore, certain Arms therein mentioned.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Armorer at Annapolis, be, and he is hereby directed to deliver to Capt. John C. Brown, of the city of Baltimore, or his order, fusees, or muskets, not exceeding seventy-five in number, upon bond being given by him to be approved by the Adjutant General.*

No. 60.

Passed Mar. 29, 1838, Resolution in favor of Andrew Slicer, and John Quynn.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to Andrew Slicer, messenger to the Senate, and John Quynn, door-keeper to the House of Delegates the sum of sixty dollars each, for taking care of the furniture in their respective rooms, during the recess of the Legislature.*

No. 61.

Passed Mar. 29, 1838, Resolution relative to the Commissioners Court of Calvert County.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioners Court of Calvert county, be directed to make a temporary investment in some monied institution, of the money granted by Congress to the Commissioners Court of Calvert county, for the benefit of said county, so as to produce an interest of not less than six per cent per annum.*
