CHAPTER 47.

Passed Feb. 12, 1838, *An act for the relief of John Beard, Jr., Collector of the Tax, for the first collection district in Anne Arundel County.*

Time extended SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That John Beard, Jr., Collector of the Tax for the first collection district in Anne Arundel county, be, and he is hereby allowed six months from the passage of this act, within which to complete his collection of said Tax, and that he is authorised to make said collection in the manner prescribed by law.*

Accounts, affidavits required

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted, That the aforesaid John Beard, Jr., shall in every instance, before he may proceed to the aforesaid collection, make affidavit before some Justice of the Peace of said county, that the same remains unpaid, and that he hath not received any security or satisfaction for the same, or any part thereof, more than the credits that may be allowed thereon.*

CHAPTER 48.

Passed Feb. 12, 1838, *An act to divorce Elizabeth Jay, of Washington county, from her husband, William Jay.*

Divorce

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Elizabeth Jay, of Washington county, be, and she is hereby declared to be divorced from her husband, William Jay, a vinculo matrimonii.

CHAPTER 49.

Passed Feb. 12, *An act to divorce Rachel Harding, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband John H. Harding.*

Divorce

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Rachel Harding, of the city of Baltimore, be, and she is hereby declared to be divorced from her husband John H. Harding, a vinculo matrimonii.*
