Shooting at wild fowl with gun by night, except from land or a blind &c. prohibited,

Or by day or night with a gun that cannot be conveniently discharged from the shoulder at arms length without rest. " "

Any person convicted before a justice of the peace or magistrates' court of violating this law, shall surrender his gun &c. to be sold, " "

And besides that forfeiture be fined \$100, " "

Said justice or court shall commit the offender if he fail to pay, " "

Proceeds of fines and sale of said gun &c. to be paid over, one-half to the informer and the other half to the levy court &c. " "

Imprisonment not to exceed 90 days, " "

Appeal to the county court provided in case the party consider himself aggrieved " 4

In all cases of violation of this act warrants in the manner of State's warrant, shall issue &c. upon oath &c. " "
