Holbrook or his deputies to receive any claim or bal- CHAP. 69. ance due by a deceased person in the same manner that Limitation claims against deceased persons are now recovered by law: and provided also, that this act shall continue in force for one year from its passage.

CHAPTER 68.

A further supplement to an act for the benefit of John S. Passed Feb. 20, Crockett and Cadmus Dashiell, administrators of Matthias Dashiell.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Former act ex-That the act, entitled, an act for the benefit of John S. Crockett and Cadmus Dashiell, administrators of Mathias Dashiell, passed at December session eighteen hundred and thirty-five, which expired by its own limitations on the tenth of February, eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, and which was extended for one year from the eighteenth day of March, eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, be and the same is hereby extended and shall continue in full force for one year, and not more, from the passage of this act.

CHAPTER 69.

An act authorising a per diem allowance to the Crier of Passed Feb. 23, Frederick county court.

WHEREAS, the memorial of W. C. Russell, Crier of Preamble Frederick county court, represents to this General Assembly that in consequence of the declension of business in Frederick county court, occasioned by the erection of Carroll county, and by the establishment of district courts, the allowance to the Crier as at present regulated by law, is very small and scarcely worth attending to:-Therefore,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That W. C. Russell, Crier of Frederick county court, and his successors, be, and is hereby authorised to re-
