CHAPTER 68.

A further supplement to an act for the benefit of John S. Crockett and Cadmus Dashiell, administrators of Matthias Dashiell.

Passed Feb. 20,
1838.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the act, entitled, an act for the benefit of John S. Crockett and Cadmus Dashiell, administrators of Matthias Dashiell, passed at December session eighteen hundred and thirty-five, which expired by its own limitations on the tenth of February, eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, and which was extended for one year from the eighteenth day of March, eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, be and the same is hereby extended and shall continue in full force for one year, and not more, from the passage of this act.

CHAPTER 69.

An act authorising a per diem allowance to the Crier of Frederick county court.

Passed Feb. 23,
1838

Russell, Crier of Frederick county court, represents to this General Assembly that in consequence of the declension of business in Frederick county court, occasioned by the erection of Carroll county, and by the establishment of district courts, the allowance to the Crier as at present regulated by law, is very small and scarcely worth attending to:—Therefore,
