CHAPTER 70.

Passed Feb. 23, 1838. *An act for the relief of Mary Steel and Catharine Carr, of Frederick county.*

Levy for, directed

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the levy court of Frederick be, and they are hereby authorised, directed and empowered to levy and assess on the assessable property of said county at their next meeting, a sum of money at their discretion, not exceeding thirty dollars each, for the use and benefit of Mary Steel and Catharine Carr, of Frederick county, and the same amount annually thereafter for each of the persons above named during their lives, to be paid to their order.

CHAPTER 71.

Passed Feb. 21, 1838. *A supplement to an act, entitled, an act authorising Henry Fecte, surviving executor of Jacob Alexander, late of Frederick county, deceased, to execute the last will and testament of said deceased, passed December session eighteen hundred and thirty-six, chapter two hundred and fourteen.*
