CHAPTER 35

(Senate Bill 69)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 288 of Article 66C of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1951 Edition—having been Section 58 of Article 39 in the 1947 Supplement), title "Natural Resources," subtitle "Fish and Fisheries," relating to the size of catfish and white or yellow perch which may be caught in the tidal waters of this State.

SECTION 1. Beit enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 288 of Article 66C of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1951 Edition—having been Section 58 of Article 39 in the 1947 Supplement), title "Natural Resources," sub-title "Fish and Fisheries," be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

288. No person shall catch or in any manner take or kill, sell, offer to buy or sell or expose for sale, or have in possession any bass, large or small mouth, less than 10 inches; any cat-fish less than [7] 8 inches; any perch, white or yellow, less than [7] 8 inches; any pike less than 14 inches; any rock, otherwise known as striped bass, less than 11 inches in length or weighing more than 15 pounds, it shall be lawful, however, in the Susquehanna River above Hog Back Shoals to catch striped bass weighing more than fifteen (15) pounds, provided said striped bass so taken are caught only with a hook and line and not sold or offered for sale; any sturgeon weighing less than 25 pounds; any taylor or bluefish less than 8 inches; any hardheads or croakers less than 7 inches; any butterfish less than 6
