and opposite the words, "Against Street Lights", so that the voters shall be able to designate by a cross mark in the proper square or box his or her decision for or against said street lights. If a majority of the votes cast in the said "Cresaptown Special Taxing Area or District" shall be "For Street Lights", then THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT shall become effective and operative immediately the provisions of this Act; but if a majority of the votes cast shall be "Against Street Lights", then this Act shall be of no effect and shall be null and void.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1951.

CHAPTER 370

(House Bill 216)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Sections 234 to 238, both inclusive, of Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "Health", sub-title "Tomatoes", as the same were repealed and re-enacted by Chapter 590 of the Acts of 1949 relating to the canning of tomatoes and tomato juice and providing penalties for violations.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 234 to 238, both inclusive, of Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, (1939 Edition), title "Health", sub-title "Tomatoes", as the same were repealed and re-enacted by Chapter 590 of the Acts of 1949 be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, so as to read as follows:

234. It shall be **[**lawful**]** unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to can or prepare in any way at any plant or factory of any kind in this State, **[**tomatoes with the juice or juices arising from the said tomatoes themselves after they have been properly peeled, trimmed, cored and prepared for
