CHAPTER 384

(House Bill 367)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 1309 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Montgomery County (1947 Edition), being Section 130-44 of the Montgomery County Code (1950 Ed.), being Article 16 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Montgomery County," sub-title "Washington Suburban Sanitary District," and Section 1444 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Prince George's County (1943 Edition), being Article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Prince George's County," sub-title "Washington Suburban Sanitary District," relating to drainage systems within the jurisdiction of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission and including an enforcement clause therein.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section 1309 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Montgomery County (1947 Edition), being Section 130-44 of the Montgomery County Code (1950 Ed.), being Article 16 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Montgomery County", sub-title "Washington Suburban Sanitary District", and Section 1444 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Prince George's County (1943 Ed.), being Article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Prince George's County," sub-title "Washington Suburban Sanitary District," be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

1309. (130-44) (1444). (a) Any Act of the General Assembly of Maryland or any ordinance or regulation of any incorporated town, special taxing district, or taxing area, inconsistent with the provisions of Sections 1303-1309 (130-38 to 130-44) (1437-1444) are hereby repealed or modified to the extent of such inconsistency.
