SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Sections 155 and 156 of Article 15 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Kent County," sub-title "County Treasurer," as said sections were amended by Chapter 511 of the Acts of 1941, be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

155. The Treasurer shall receive, as compensation for all services as Treasurer, the annual salary of **[Twenty-four] *Twenty-eight*** Hundred Dollars, payable in equal monthly installments upon the order of the said Board of County Commissioners, and no other compensation or commission shall accrue to said Treasurer in the performance of his duties as Treasurer.

156. The Treasurer shall appoint **[one or more clerks as may be necessary for the proper discharge of the duties of his office, who shall be] a** deputy Treasurer **[s]**, *who shall qualify under the Constitution of the State, and shall give such bond to the Treasurer as he may require, [but the aggregate annual salary of said clerks or deputies shall, in no case, exceed the sum of Sixteen Hundred Dollars], and he shall receive as compensation an annual salary of *Twenty-four Hundred Dollars (\$2400.00), payable in equal monthly installments.**

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1951.
