

*have power to accept any grant, devise or lease of real estate, or any gift or bequest of money or other property, or any donation to be applied, principal or income or both, for either temporary or permanent use, to parks, playgrounds or other recreational purposes.*

*(b) If any such grant, devise, lease, gift or bequest be conditional, the proper authorities of the County shall have power to accept the same upon the conditions attached and to comply with such conditions, if in the judgment of such authorities, such conditions are reasonable and for the best interests of the County. Money received in any such manner, unless otherwise provided by the terms of the gift or bequest, shall accrue and become a part of the funds available for expenditure by the Board for recreational purposes as herein defined. The County Commissioners of Baltimore County may, by and through the Board of Recreation hereby created, join or cooperate with the Federal Government, or the State of Maryland or with one or more municipalities or with one or more Baltimore County community recreation councils or with one or more other counties, or with the Baltimore County Board of Education or the Board of Recreation of one or more municipalities, or of one or more other Counties, in providing, establishing and conducting recreation centers, playgrounds, parks and other recreation facilities and activities.*

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted, That all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.*

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1951.*
