

and when such amounts are so ascertained the State Superintendent of Schools shall certify the same to the State Comptroller.

(C). IN THE CITY OF BALTIMORE OR IN ANY COUNTY IN THE STATE WHICH DOES NOT PROVIDE SUCH SPECIAL CLASSES OR SPECIAL INSTRUCTION FOR THE EDUCATION OF MENTALLY OR PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED CHILD CHILDREN, AND SUCH MENTALLY OR PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED CHILDREN ATTEND A SCHOOL WITHIN OR OUTSIDE OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND PROVIDING APPROPRIATE INSTRUCTION OR RECEIVES APPROPRIATE SPECIAL INSTRUCTION APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION, THE BOARD OF EDUCATION IN THE CITY OF BALTIMORE OR COUNTY IN WHICH THE PARENTS OF SUCH CHILD RESIDES, PROVIDED SUCH PARENTS HAVE BEEN BONA-FIDE RESIDENTS OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND FOR MORE THAN ONE YEAR, SHALL BE REIMBURSED BY THE STATE OF MARYLAND IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED SIX HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$600.00) FOR EACH SUCH MENTALLY OR PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED CHILD EACH SCHOOL YEAR THROUGH THE APPROPRIATED FUNDS IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOL BUDGET TO ASSIST IN PAYING THE TUITION AND/OR FEES INCIDENT TO THE INSTRUCTION OF EACH SAID HANDICAPPED CHILD.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1951.
