

39. *Appeal.* If anyone shall feel aggrieved by the action of the registrars in refusing to register or to strike off the name of any person, or by any other action, such person feeling aggrieved may appeal to the Board of Supervisors of Elections. Any decision or action of the board may be appealed to the council, and the council's decision shall be final.

40. *Voting Places and Ballots.* It shall be the duty of the Board of Supervisors of Elections to provide for each city and primary election a suitable place or places for voting in each precinct, suitable ballot boxes, and ballots in the form and arranged as provided by Sections 62, 63 and 64 of Article 33 of the Annotated Code of the Public General Laws of Maryland (1947 Cumulative Supplement) and all amendments thereto, except that such ballots shall contain the name of every candidate whose nomination has been certified to and filed according to the provisions of this charter.

41. *Nomination.* No person shall be a candidate for any public office in the government of the City of Salisbury unless such person shall be nominated either by a primary election or by petition in accordance with the provisions of this charter.

42. *Primary Elections.* Each political party which shall have polled ten per cent of the entire vote cast in the state at the next preceding general election may hold in the City of Salisbury on the second Tuesday in April of each year in which a general city election is scheduled, a primary election at which any qualified and registered voter of the City of Salisbury and of the party holding such primary election shall be entitled to vote. The Board of Supervisors of Elections shall give at least six weeks notice, by publication in some newspaper printed in the City of Salisbury, of the time and place or places of holding such primary election. The polls shall be open from 7 o'clock A.M. to 7 o'clock P.M. Ballots of the same form and arrangement as those used in city elections shall be furnished by the Board of Supervisors of Elections for each primary election and shall contain the name of each person who shall file with the city clerk at least twenty days prior to the time for holding the primary election by which he seeks nomination, notice in writing of his desire to be voted on at such election, the office for which he wishes to become a candidate, and the party with which he is affiliated.
