

enacted by Chapters 793 and 820 of the Acts of 1947, and to be under the sub-title "Washington Suburban Sanitary District", extending the boundaries of the Washington Suburban Sanitary District.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That a new section be and it is hereby added to the Code of Public Local Laws of Montgomery County (1947 Edition), and to the Montgomery County Code (1950 Edition), being Article 16 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Montgomery County", said new section to be known as Section 1283B, to follow immediately after Section 1283A of said Article, and to be under the sub-title "Washington Suburban Sanitary District", and that a new section be and it is hereby added to the Code of Public Local Laws of Prince George's OF PUBLIC LOCAL LAWS OF PRINCE GEORGE'S County (1943 Edition), being Article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, said new section to be known as Section 1420G, to follow immediately after Section 1420F, as enacted by Chapters 793 and 820 of the Acts of 1947, and to be under the sub-title "Washington Suburban Sanitary District", and both to read as follows:

*1283B. 1420G. The area of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission and the jurisdiction of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission, its duties, authority and powers are hereby extended to include the additional territory within the following designated and described boundaries:*

*Beginning for the same at a point west of, at right angles to and 150 feet distant from the center line of Water Street in the Town of Gaithersburg said point being on the southwest property line of the lot retained by the grantor in the conveyance from Oscar F. Fulls and Edith M. Fulls to the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission as recorded among the Land Records of Montgomery County in Liber C. W. K. 612, Folio 345 and also a point on the existing boundary of the Washington Suburban Sanitary District; thence*

*in a generally southerly direction west of, parallel to and 150 feet distant from the center line of said Water Street to the center line of Chambers Lane (a road leading to the residence of Robert Chambers); thence*

*in a southeasterly direction along the center line of said Chambers Lane approximately 150 feet to the center line of the aforementioned Water Street; thence*

*in a straight line to the most westerly corner of the property of the Board of Education of Montgomery County*
