powering the Comptroller of the Treasury, the State Appeal Board, the various local Boards of License Commissioners and Liquor Control Boards, all enforcement officers and the Judges and Clerks of the various Courts of this State with sufficient authority to administer and enforce the provisions of this Article. The restrictions, regulations, provisions and penalties contained in this Article are for the protection, health, welfare and safety of the people of this State. It shall also be the policy of the State to tax alcoholic beverages as provided in this Article.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1951.

CHAPTER 567

(House Bill 401)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 381 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Prince George's County (1943 Edition), being Article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Prince George's County", subtitle "County Commissioners", said section having been amended by Chapter 23 of the Acts of the Regular Session of 1950, relating generally to the powers and duties of the County Commissioners of Prince George's County and to the administration of the County government in Prince George's County.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 381 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Prince George's County (1943 Edition), being Article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Prince George's County", sub-title "County Commissioners", said section having been amended by Chapter 23 of the Acts of the Regular Session of 1950, be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

381A. (a) There shall be five County Commissioners for Prince George's County, elected for a term of four years, and
