Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1951.

## CHAPTER 574

## (House Bill 452)

AN ACT to authorize the Mayor and Aldermen of Annapolis, Maryland, to pay a pension to Mrs. Sarah A. Holliday, widow of John B. Holliday; and to Mr. Edward T. Beavin, a former employee of the City of Annapolis.

WHEREAS, John B. Holliday faithfully served as patrolman in Annapolis, Anne Arundel County, for a number of years; and

WHEREAS, John B. Holliday died on September 12, 1946; and

WHEREAS, John B. Holliday left as his widow, Mrs. Sarah A. Holliday, who is now in dire need of financial assistance; and

Whereas, Mr. Edward T. Beavin, a resident and disabled former employee of the City of Annapolis rendered faithful service to the City during his period of employment; now therefore

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Mayor and Aldermen of Annapolis, Maryland, be and they are hereby authorized to pay to Mrs. Sarah A. Holliday, widow of John B. Holliday, a former patrolman of Annapolis, a monthly pension of Sixty Dollars (\$60.00), during her widowhood; said Mayor and Aldermen of Annapolis also are authorized to pay a monthly pension of Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) to Mr. Edward T. Beavin of Annapolis.
