- SEC. 3. And be it further enacted, That a new section be and the same is hereby added to Article 81 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1947 Supp.), title "Revenue and Taxes," sub-title "General Provisions," heading "State Tax Commission," to be known as Section 180B, to follow immediately after Section 180A, as said Section 180A was enacted by Chapter 63 of the Acts of 1949, and to read as follows:
- 180B. In every county and in every incorporated municipality where building permits are required, the person or agency responsible for the issuance of such building permit shall immediately, upon its issuance, furnish a copy thereof to the Supervisor of Assessments of the county, and in the case of Baltimore City, to the Supervisor of Assessments for said city. The penalties prescribed by Sections 163 to 166, inclusive, of this Article shall apply to the failure of any person to carry out the provisions of this Section.
- SEC. 4. And be it further enacted, That all laws or parts of laws, whether public general or public local, inconsistent with the provisions of this Act be and they are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- SEC. 5. And be it further enacted, That if any clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Act shall, for any reason, be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional and invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, or section thereof so found unconstitutional and invalid.
- SEC. 6. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1951.
