

ances, the preservation of health and the suppression of vice and immorality within the limits of the said town; and shall have the power to lay an equal tax on the property within said limits, to such an amount as may from time to time be deemed necessary to accomplish the purposes aforesaid, which tax shall be collected and paid to the President and Commissioners, by the collector by them appointed, who shall have the same power to destrain therefor, as the collector of the public county assessment has to destrain for the same; provided, said tax shall not exceed thirty cents on the One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of the taxable property of said town, for any one year; and the said President and Commissioners shall fix the term of office, amount of bond and compensation for such collector.

304K. The said Commissioners, or a majority of them, shall have full power and authority annually to appoint a bailiff, whose duty it shall be to preserve the peace and good order of said town, and to perform such other duties as may be assigned him by said Commissioners, or a majority of them; and for this purpose, he is hereby vested with the same power and authority as any constable may now have under the laws of this State.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That all Acts, or parts of Acts, inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, be and the same are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1951.
