the members of the Council may be reimbursed for any expense actually incurred in prosecuting the official business of the municipality.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted. That this Act shall be submitted to the legally qualified voters of the Town of Brunswick at the regular municipal election in August, 1951, and there shall be printed on each ballot to be used in said election the title of this Act, and underneath thereof on separate lines, the words "For Increased Salary for Mayor and Members of the Council" and "Against Increased Salary for Mayor and Members of the Council", with a square opposite said words at the right end of each line, so that each voter can indicate his or her choice on said question.

The said election shall be conducted and the results thereof ascertained in accordance with the Constitution and Laws of this State relating to elections, and if it shall appear from the results of said election that a majority of the votes cast are "Against Increased Salary for Mayor and Members of the Council", then this Act shall not become effective and it shall be null and void, but if a majority of the votes cast are "For Increased Salary for Mayor and Members of the Council", then this Act shall immediately become effective.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1951.

## CHAPTER 95

## (House Bill 90)

AN ACT to add a new section to Article 99 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1947 Edition), title "Birds, Game and Inland Water Fish," sub-title "Regulations for Taking of Game and Fresh Water Game Fish in Non-Tidal Waters," said new section to be known as Section 110A and to follow immediately after Section 110 of said Article, assenting to the Act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide that the United States shall aid the States in fish restoration and
