sistants at such compensation as shall be provided for in the annual Ordinance of Estimates of said City. Provision shall also be made in said Ordinance for the expenses of the office of the Sheriff, including the purchase and maintenance of motor vehicles, and the Mayor and City Council shall have the same power with respect to the salaries and expenses of the office of Sheriff as it has under the City Charter with respect to the salaries and expenses of all municipal departments. Provided further, that from and after June 1, 1951, JANU-ARY 1, 1952, each of the deputies, assistants and employees for whom provision is made hereinabove in this sub-section shall be allowed and paid a salary increase at the rate of \$500. per year, said increase to be based upon and to be in addition to the rate of compensation or salary received by each such deputy, assistant or employee immediately prior to June 1. 1951. DECEMBER 31, 1950.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1951. JANUARY 1, 1952.
