

Election," with a square after said words, in each case, for the (X) mark of the voter, and the voter may vote thereon by an (X) mark after his choice, and if there be a majority of votes cast in favor of the amended charter, then this Act and the provisions thereof shall go into effect immediately; and if there be a majority of votes cast against the amended charter, then this Act shall be null and void.

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1951.

CHAPTER 113

(House Bill 174)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Sub-sections 22(b) and 22(c) of Article 2B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1947 Supplement), title "Alcoholic Beverages," sub-title "Special and Temporary Licenses;" and to add a new section to said Article 2B, said new section to be known as Section 26A, to follow immediately after Section 26 thereof and to be under the sub-title "Local Licenses and License Provisions," amending the laws concerning licenses for the sale of certain alcoholic beverages in Baltimore County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Sub-sections 22(b) and 22(c) of Article 2B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1947 Supplement), title "Alcoholic Beverages," sub-title "Special and Temporary Licenses," be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

22. (b) (Beer, and Beer and Wine, Class C, 7 Days.) Special beer license, Class C, or a special beer and wine license, Class C, which shall entitle the holder thereof to exercise any of the privileges conferred by the said respective classes of licenses for the use of any person holding any bona fide entertainment conducted by any club, society or association at the place therein described, for a period not exceeding seven consecutive
