86. Offenses in connection with issuance or use of identification cards.

Any person, firm, association or corporation licensed under the provisions of this sub-title who shall issue identification cards to any person other than a bona fide employee, or who shall sell, issue, rent, loan or distribute badges or membership cards indicating that the holder thereof is a private detective or investigator or is engaged in the private detective business, to any person or persons other than those lawfully entitled to such identification cards shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

87. Investigations; subpocnas; witnesses; fees; oath; wilful false swearing.

For the purpose of investigating the character, competency, integrity and methods of operation of applicants or licensees hereunder, or of the officers, directors, operatives, agents or employees of any applicant or licensee, the superintendent shall have the power to issue subpoends and compel the attendance of witnesses. All such subpoents shall be under the hand of the superintendent and the seal of his department, and upon service thereof the witnesses shall be paid or tendered the fees to which they would be entitled if they were subvocaaed by a court of record. If the person duly subpocnaed shall fail to obey such subpocna without reasonable cause, or shall without cause refuse to be examined or answer any relevant or proper questions as to the chaarcter, actions or qualifications of such applicant or licensee or any of his employees he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. The testimony of witnesses in any proceeding before the superintendent shall be under oath and the superintendent or a subordinate of the superintendent designated in writing by the superintendent may administer such oath.

88. Licensees of other states.

Any person, firm, association or corporation incorporated or licensed under the laws of any other State of the United States, and intending to conduct a private detective business or act as a private detective or investigator within this State shall file in the office of the superintendent a written application duly signed and verified and obtain from the superintendent a license as herein provided and shall be subject to all the provisions of this sub-title.

89. Licenses under prior laws.

Licenses issued under the pertinent provisions of Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws prior to June 1, 1951, au-
