The Orphans' Court may also provide in its Final Order for sale of any property, upon such terms as it deems advisable and for the distribution of the proceeds in accordance with its final order.

In those cases where the Orphans' Court is satisfied that the allowable funeral expenses of a male OR UNMAR-RIED FEMALE decedent are equal to or exceed the known assets of the decedent's estate, the Orphans' Court, after hearing and disposing of any objections filed in the Orphans' Court by anyone interested in the estate, may pass a Final Order as hereinbefore provided without the necessity of a Preliminary Order, notice to creditors, or Statement.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1951.

## CHAPTER 283

## (Senate Bill 55)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 771 of Article 11 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Frederick County," sub-title "Thurmont," as said section was enacted AMENDED by Chapter 693 of the Acts of 1947, extending the taxation laws of the Town of Thurmont throughout its corporate bounds.
