

CHAPTER 294

(Senate Bill 139)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, sub-section (a) of Section 96 of Article 65 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1947 Supplement), title "Militia," sub-title "Re-employment of Persons in Military Service," as said sub-section (a) of Section 96 was amended by Chapter 238 of the Acts of 1949, relating to the rights and status of any person entering the armed services between the period beginning June 1, 1950 and ending June 1, 1953, in any pension or retirement fund or system.

SECTION 1. *Beit enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That sub-section (a) of Section 96 of Article 65 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1947 Supplement), title "Militia," sub-title "Re-employment of Persons in Military Service," as said sub-section (a) of Section 96 was amended by Chapter 238 of the Acts of 1949, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

96. (a) The rights and status of any person inducted into the land or naval forces of the United States within the period beginning September 1, 1940, and ending December 31, 1945, or *within the period beginning June 1, 1950, and ending June 1, 1953,* for training and service pursuant to the Act of Congress known as the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940, or any subsequent Acts of a similar nature, and any member of any reserve component of the land or naval forces of the United States on active duty or service within said period or ordered or assigned to active duty or service within said period, as well as any person who, within said period, enlists in the armed forces of the United States, and who may be absent in such military service shall be as follows in any pension or retirement fund or system, including the Teachers Retirement system of the State of Maryland: During the period of such absence, no such person or his estate shall have any right or be entitled to ordinary disability benefits, accidental disability benefits, death benefits, optional
