funds to insure adequate service in the process of unemployment insurance claims, and,

Be it further resolved:

That inasmuch as Maryland has only had approximately 65% of the money in Unemployment Compensation AD-MINISTRATION taxes collected in Maryland returned to Maryland, that an immediate Federal Grant be requested to relieve this situation that has developed.

Be it further resolved:

That copies of this resolution be sent to the Governor of the State of Maryland, the President of the United States, and the two Senators and seven Congressmen, urging them to aid in getting additional funds for Maryland.

## No. 6

## (Senate Joint Resolution 7)

Senate Joint Resolution requesting the Governor and the Director of the Budget to submit the fiscal program and supporting documents to the members of the General Assembly prior to the convening of the General Assembly in the Budgetary Sessions in even years.

Whereas, the members of the General Assembly are anxious to make the best possible use of their time for the study of budgetary and financial problems at the thirty-day sessions which convene in even years; and

Whereas, it would be most helpful to the members of the General Assembly if they were enabled to have the Governor's budget and fiscal program prior to the convening of the General Assembly in even years in order to increase the time during which they might study these programs; and

Whereas, it is required by the Constitution that in the ninety-day sessions of the General Assembly which con-
