

CHAPTER 627

(Senate Bill 425)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Sub-section (Allegany County) of Section 100 AND SECTION 104 of Article 52 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1951 Edition), title "Justices of the Peace", sub-title "Trial Magistrates' System", said sub-section having been amended by Chapter 460 of the Acts of 1949 and by Chapter 110 of the Acts of 1951, AND TO ADD SECTION 111 (B-1) TO SAID ARTICLE AND SUB-TITLE, SAID NEW SECTION TO FOLLOW IMMEDIATELY AFTER SECTION 111 (B) THEREOF, increasing the annual salaries of the several Trial Magistrates AND OF THE SUBSTITUTE TRIAL MAGISTRATES in Allegany County, RELATING ALSO TO THE CLERICAL ASSISTANCE FOR TRIAL MAGISTRATES IN ALLEGANY COUNTY and correcting an error in said sub-section of Article 52.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Sub-section (Allegany County) of Section 100 AND SECTION 104 of Article 52 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1951 Edition), title "Justices of the Peace", sub-title "Trial Magistrates' System", said sub-section having been amended by Chapter 460 of the Acts of 1949 and by Chapter 110 of the Acts of 1951, be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, AND THAT A NEW SECTION 111 (B-1) BE AND THE SAME IS HEREBY ADDED TO SAID ARTICLE AND SUB-TITLE, SAID NEW SECTION TO FOLLOW IMMEDIATELY AFTER SECTION 111 (B) THEREOF AND ALL to read as follows:

(Allegany County.) There shall be twelve Trial Magistrates, two of whom shall sit for the trial of cases in the City of Cumberland, two at Frostburg, one at Westernport, one at Lonaconing, one at Mt. Savage, one at Midland, one at Cresaptown, one at Barton, one at Old-
