of another for the purpose of invading the privacy of the occupant by looking through a window, door or aperture, and providing for a penalty upon conviction thereof.

SECTION 1. Beit enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That a new section be and it is hereby added to Article 27 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1951 Edition), title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Trespass," said new section to be known as Section 302A, to follow immediately after Section 302 of said Article, and to read as follows:

- 302A. Any person who shall enter upon the land or premises of another for the purpose of invading the privacy of the occupants of any building or enclosure located thereon, by looking into any window, door or other aperture of such building or enclosure, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than Two Hundred FIFTY Dollars or imprisoned for not more than two years THIRTY DAYS, or both fined and imprisoned.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1953.
