## CHAPTER 732

(House Bill 783)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 422 of the Charter and Public Local Laws of Baltimore City (1949 Edition), being Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Baltimore City", sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables", relating to the compensation of the Chief Police Magistrate and the Police Magistrates of Baltimore City.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section 422 of the Charter of Public Local Laws of Baltimore City (1949 Edition), being Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Baltimore City", sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables", be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, and to read as follows:

422. The Justices of the Peace selected to sit at a station-house in the City of Baltimore and designated by the Governor as the "Chief Police Magistrate of Baltimore
