Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Dorchester County", sub-title "Vienna", as enacted by Chapter 205 of the Acts of 1937, raising the borrowing power of the Commissioners of Vienna from One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000).

SECTION 1. Beit enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 533 of Article 10 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Dorchester County", sub-title "Vienna", as enacted by Chapter 205 of the Acts of 1937 be and and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, and to read as follows:

- 533. The said Commissioners shall also have power to impose license fees on any business, occupation or employment conducted in said town whether temporary or permanent; to provide for fire protection, police protection, for lights upon the highways of the town; to arrange for a supply of water for fire protection and for the use of its citizens; and to borrow money on their notes or certificates of indebtedness to an amount not to exceed [one] ten thousand dollars, in any one year, this borrowing right to be in addition to any other borrowing right that the said Commissioners of Vienna now have.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1953.

CHAPTER 176

(Senate Bill 276)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 139 (b) of Article 2B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1951 Edition), title "Alcoholic Beverages", subtitle "Boards of License Commissioners", providing for the appointment of the members of the Board of License Commissioners of Allegany County as of June 1, 1953 and clarifying the provisions of said section.

SECTION 1. Beit enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 139 (b) of Article 2B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1951 Edition), title "Alcoholic Beverages",
