

Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Dorchester County", sub-title "Licenses", said section having been enacted by Chapter 896 of the Acts of 1943, increasing the penalty for a violation of the law concerning the obtaining of building permits in Dorchester County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section 364A of Article 10 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Dorchester County", sub-title "Licenses", said section having been enacted by Chapter 896 of the Acts of 1943, be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

364A. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to build, erect, repair or improve any building or structure in Dorchester County, costing in excess of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), without having first obtained from the County Commissioners of Dorchester County a building permit therefor.

Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a penalty of **[Fifty Dollars (\$50.00)]** *Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00)*, payable to the County Commissioners of Dorchester County, aforesaid, one-half of which shall be paid by the owners of said property and one-half by the contractor or builder, said penalty to be recovered as small debts are recovered.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1953.
