Bring a negro Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, slave into this That from and after the passage of this act, James T. State. Pritchett, of the city of Baltimore, be, and he is hereby authorised to bring into this State, from the State of Virginia, negro girl Margaret, a slave for life, aged eight years, on complying with the provisions of an act passed at December session, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, chapter fifteen.

CHAPTER 163.

Passed March An act to repeal an act passed at December session, eighteen 3, 1845. hundred and forty-two, chapter four.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That an act of Assembly, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and forty-two, chapter four, entitled, an act to authorise the citizens of Worcester county to plant oysters, and for the protection of the same, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 164.

Passed March 3, 1845.

An act to authorise S. Teackle Wallis, to bring into this State, a negro slave therein mentioned.

Bring a negro slave into this

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That S. Teackle Wallis, Esq'r. of Baltimore city, be and he is hereby authorised to bring into this State a negro slave named Oliver, upon complying with the provisions of the act of eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, chapter fifteen.
