SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall not in force two continue in force longer than two years from the first day

of July next.

## CHAPTER 291.

Asupplement to an act entitled, an act for the Inspection Passed March of Sole Leather, Rough Harness and Rough Skirting Leather in the City of Baltimore.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of To appoint 2 Maryland, That it shall be the duty of the Governor, by additional inand with the advice and consent of the Senate, immediately upon the passage of this act, to appoint two additional inspectors of leather for the city of Baltimore; and annually hereafter to appoint five instead of three inspectors of leather for the said city, whose qualifications, duties and responsibilities shall be the same, as those prescribed in the original act, to which this is a supplement.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the fees arising from Fees made a the inspection of leather in the city of Baltimore, shall be common fund. considered and made a common fund to be equally divided among all the inspectors.

## CHAPTER 292.

An additional supplement to the act, entitled an act for the Passed March preservation and repair of that part of the United States 10, 1845. Road within the limits of Maryland.

SECTION. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Appoint three Maryland, That in lieu of the appointment of a superincompetent pertendent of that part of the United States road lying with- sons. in the limits of this State, as has been heretofore done in pursuance of the act to which this is a supplement, the Governor shall by and with the advice and consent of the
