

hundred and thirty-eight, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to collect any and all taxes now remaining due and uncollected by said Mayberry in the county aforesaid, in the same manner and with the same privileges and powers, as are allowed by the existing laws in such cases made and provided.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall not continue in force longer than two years from the first day of July next.

CHAPTER 291.

As supplement to an act entitled, an act for the Inspection of Sole Leather, Rough Harness and Rough Skirting Leather in the City of Baltimore.

Passed March 10, 1845.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That it shall be the duty of the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, immediately upon the passage of this act, to appoint two additional inspectors of leather for the city of Baltimore; and annually hereafter to appoint five instead of three inspectors of leather for the said city, whose qualifications, duties and responsibilities shall be the same, as those prescribed in the original act, to which this is a supplement.

To appoint 2 additional inspectors.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the fees arising from the inspection of leather in the city of Baltimore, shall be considered and made a common fund to be equally divided among all the inspectors.

Fees made a common fund.

CHAPTER 292.

An additional supplement to the act, entitled an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States Road within the limits of Maryland.

Passed March 10, 1845.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That in lieu of the appointment of a superintendent of that part of the United States road lying within the limits of this State, as has been heretofore done in pursuance of the act to which this is a supplement, the Governor shall by and with the advice and consent of the
