CHAP. 294. Order of Independent Odd Fellows, attached to the Grand
Lodge of Maryland, and their successors, be and they are
hereby incorporated and made a body politic and corporate, by the name and number of Mount Savage Lodge,
number forty-three, of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, of the State of Maryland; and by that name may sue
and be sued, and have a common seal, and the same at their
pleasure alter, and be entitled to use the powers and privileges incident to such corporation.

Hold personal estate.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the said corporation shall be capable of taking and holding real and personal estate, not exceeding in value the sum of four thousand dollars, which estate shall never be divided among the members of the corporation, but shall descend to their successors, for the benevolent relief of the sick and distressed, the education of the orphans of its members, and for the promotion of those purposes generally.

Proviso.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That this corporation shall have power to alter and amend their by-laws at pleasure; provided, they do not conflict with the laws of the State of Maryland, the laws of the United States, or the laws of the Grand Lodge.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That this act of incorporation shall enure for thirty years from its passage, and that the Legislature reserves to itself the right to alter and amend this act of incorporation at pleasure.
