No. 14.

Resolution authorising the Treasurer to receive from the President of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, certain Coupons in their possession. Passed Feb 14, 1845.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the commissioner of loans receive from and give his receipt to the president or other proper officer of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, for the coupons now in their possession, and amounting to £21,475, sterling, as appears by the sixteenth annual report of the said company, dated the third of June, eighteen hundred and forty-four, and that the said coupons, when so received, be retained by the said commissioners, for the purpose of being cancelled and destroyed, at the time and in manner directed for the cancellation or coupons received in payment of taxes.

No. 15.

Resolution requesting His Excellency, the Governor, to transmit certain Resolutions to our Senators and Representatives in Congress. Passed Feb 20, 1845.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Governor transmit to the Senators and Representatives of this State in Congress, the preamble and resolutions passed by the General Assembly of Maryland, in favor of pledging the public lands for the payment of two hundred millions of stock recommended to be issued for the relief of all the States.
