Passed March 8, 1845. Resolution in relation to the State Wharfinger.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Wharfinger cause the water in front of the State Tobacco Warehouse in the city of Baltimore, numbered three, to be deepened, so as to float vessels of the draft usually landing at the said wharf, and that he be authorised to apply for that purpose the necessary amount of money arising from wharfages in said city, not exceeding the sum of one hundred and twenty-five doilars.
